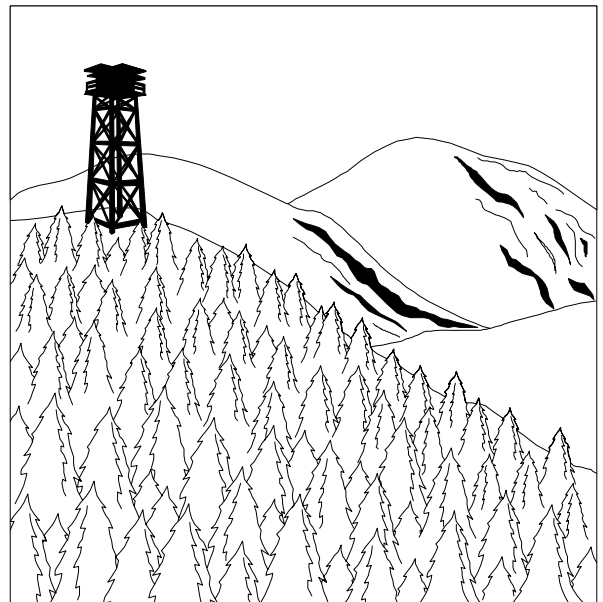

The Association is working with the Alberta Municipal Health & Safety Association in order to fill the need, in "Rural Alberta", for a safer workplace and in the long-term, a decrease in costs to the municipalities.

We are supportive of the Partners in Injury Reduction Program, which the Workers' Compensation Board, Alberta Occupational Health & Safety and Alberta Municipal Health & Safety Association have developed.

We continue our support and programs for those who have not had a change in responsibilities and who are still involved in public utility operation, coordination, installation and/or inspection.

In summary, the Association has always been concerned with issues of safety in our respective municipalities and plans to carry on this directive.

GOALS

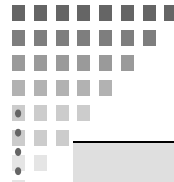
-  To ensure long term viability of the Association;

The Rural Utilities & Safety Association was formerly the Utilities Officer Association of Alberta, with its beginnings in 1973. The association was a support group for "Local Utilities Officers" who were hired initially to inspect and coordinate the installation of natural gas services in Rural Alberta.

In the years to follow, the duties of the Utilities Officer were expanded to include the coordination and/or installation and/or operation of all utilities within the municipal boundaries. During this time, Utilities Officers also carried out various other duties for their municipalities, many of which were related directly to safety or safety issues. As a result, the Association has evolved to respond to those needs.

In working with our neighbors: the Towns, Villages and other small urban centers; it became evident that we had common duties and responsibilities and, in many cases, were partners in projects and/or utility coordination. We had a common mandate also: the need to ensure the safety of contractors, workers, the public and future generations when working on or living near to any utility in the municipality.

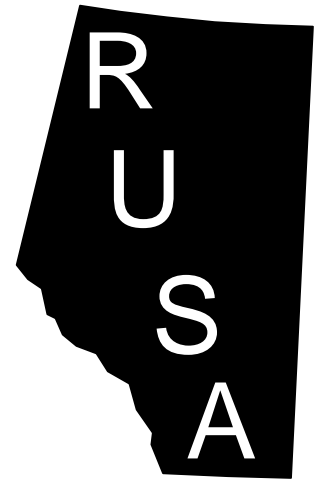
The workshops have been a cooperative effort between the

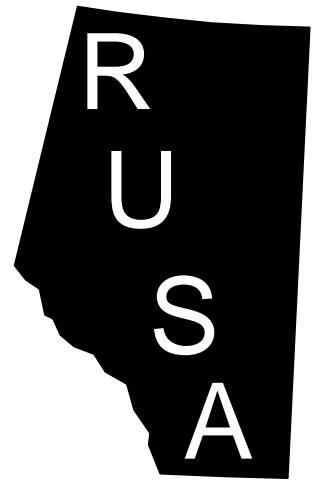
